. STEM to STEAM: Global forum eyes higher edu focus on arts too

New Delhi: At its third meeting in Beijing, the Global University Association Forum (GUAF) reached a consensus on prioritising artificial intelligence (AI) for education, global mobility through academic equivalence, and promoting sustainable campuses.

On the sidelines of the forum, agreements for collaboration at the country and institutional levels in research were signed. Chhatrapati Shahu Ji Maharaj University (CSJMU), Kanpur, and universities from China agreed to collaborate in research, aiming to provide students from both countries with a global platform for their studies.
