National Conference on On 'अमत्काल' and Changing Media: Resurgence of New India

The two-day National Conference, on 'अमृत काल ' and Changing' Media: Resurgence of New India', sponsored by Indian Council for Social Science Research (ICSSR) Delhi in association with SCDR, JNU was organised by Vivekananda School of Journalism and Mass Communication, VIPS – TC on March 22-23, 2023 at the VIPS campus. The two-day conference witnessed the participation of hundreds of delegates, academicians. research scholars. media professionals and students across the country in a hybrid mode: offline as well as online. The twoday conference touched upon diverse issues around the central theme of 'Atmanirbhar Bharat'— Economy, Technology-driven Infrastructure, Systems, Vibrant demography, and Demand. In the current scenario the nation's emphasis is on creating wealth and values not only for ourselves, but for the larger humanity; India always has believed in the idea of 'VasudhaiyaKutumbakam'. The goal for the nation is to develop a New India that needs to be achieved by keeping pace with the developments happening around the globe, which also require the application of innovative process, methodology, and newer tools for policymakers as well as other implementing agencies. The national conference aimed at the central theme of 'Amrit Kaal' and how the changing media has to play the role in creating a new India. It aimed at highlighting, acknowledging and exploring the role and relevance of media in forming a New India. The conference put it best efforts in creating a platform for professionals, academicians, policymakers,

researchers, social scientists, economists, and learners to deliberate on the ways, processes, campaigns, and case studies on defining the role and responsibilities of media towards building a self-reliant Atma Nirbhar Bharat leading to the emergence of a New India. The two-day conference through various sessions touched upon several sub-themes also on which deliberations took place. With over 55 research and academic papers across the country from over 25 universities the conference was highly successful. It focused on quality research work having a futuristic approach.

For having Conference on an auspicious day of Hindu New Year; , in her opening remarks by Conference Head, Prof. Dr Charu Lata Singh appreciated the relevance of conference theme and efforts of committee members and guests. wished everyone a happy Hindu New Year - Vikram Samvat 2080. The h Guest of Honour, Sh. Anand Sharma, former Addl. DG Meterology, Gov. of India, in his address focused on the role of social or digital media specially in context with Kedarnath tragedy, which they had predicted beforehand

and recent issues of Joshimath. He put light on PM's vision – 100 yrs of independence, 10-point agenda of disaster risk reduction and the effect of Technology such as the Digital India Initiative, the use of Digital Payments at local shops and vendors all over India. He also discussed the

role of Media in weather economy disaster management. High emissions and increased Global Warming, changes in the climate pressure are leading to extreme weather. He talked about communities living in vulnerable areas, and natural hazards due to climate variability and said,"Our Job is we can't stop the Hazard, but we can reduce the impact and prevent them from becoming disaster". Sh Anand Sharma is popularly known as the weatherman of Uttarakhand and was in charge during the 2013 Kedarnath Disaster. He reflected on the role of prediction, and the lack of Communication between govt channels and said, "Meteorology cannot reach to people without media". He also talked about Joshi Math problems, media coverage, and misinformation (e.g. Cloud Burst in mountains) should be prevented at all costs . "Do They Know What We Mean?" is a Training Program to guide and give the right information to the right people at the right time, which can prevent hazards turning into disasters. He ended by referring to the power of social media, colorcoded Warnings which further helps to enhance efficiency to save people. The Chief Guest of the inaugural session, Prof. P K Joshi, Chairperson Special Center for Disaster Research (SCDR) and Professor School of **Environmental** Sciences (SES), Jawaharlal Nehru University, spoke on the role and importance of media in creating awareness on environmental issues and disaster management. Prof Joshi expressed his opinion on the emerging new media, the importance of media houses in behaving responsibly and keeping in touch with reality, instead of sensationalising different issues. He exemplified the term 'Amrit Kal', used by the Finance Minister Nirmala Shitharaman during the Budget Presentation for the year 2023 and further by the Prime Minister

Narendra Modi at various platforms. Prof Joshi shared his experience about media consumption on social media, television, newspapers, radio and also the folk media including nukkad natak and stage plays. He expressed that the value system in India, has been in dynamically changing post 1991 Economic Liberalisation. With the broadcast of channels like CNN, BBC and others .he coverage of the war gave different exposure to the Indian audience altogether. He emphasised on the role of digital media, the importance of various forms of media being the pillar of democracy. Prof Joshi also shared his views on generating scientific temper and how the media should investigate through the prism of science and facts. Living in the era of the anthropogenic, we need to be more responsible as humans are less than 2% of all in the phenomenon, but dominate the rest 98% of living beings. Responsible media coverage is not about running for the TRP race,

but to a higher degree of authority and truth validation. He said that the top leadership is working on -Glasgow CDRI, LIFE - Lifestyle for the environment, recognised by UN and UNICEF. Prof Joshi concluded by encouraging the house towards the National Education Policy 2020 - the introduction towards a new world in education, and Amrit Kal and the new India. In his concluding remarks Conference Chair: Prof. Sidharth Mishra, Chairperson VSJMC & VRC, thanked all the guests and attendees of the conference and talked about how the previous night the earthquake of March 21, 2023, jolted the people of Delhi – NCR. He spoke about how fake news on social media and YouTube disaster coverage unnecessarily create panic among masses. He also stressed that media should be for the sake of knowledge and information and not for TRP and Breaking News". Presenting his Vote of Thanks at the inaugural session, conference convener, Dr Ramesh Kumar expressed his deep regards to management for their immense support. Presenting on the behalf of the External Research Committee, he thanked all delegates, chief guest for the session Prof PK Joshi from JNU, the guest of honour Sh Anand Sharma, Addl DG, IMD, Govt of India, Sh Dalip Kumar, Registrar, VIPS - TC, Prof Anuradha Jain, Principal VIPS – TC, Prof Siddharth Mishra, chairperson, VSJMC & VRC, Prof Dr Charu Lata Singh, Dean VSJMC, organising committee members Dr Praveen Kumar Singh, Dr Chetna Bhatia, Dr Mona Gupta, Dr Atul Upadhyay, all other faculty and students.


The Functional exposure training was mentored by Dr Manoj Kumar Sharma, Dr Amit Channa, and Dr Aneela Tahilramani. In this 3 Week training, Lectures were conducted to give a better understanding of the topics to the student, and daily tasks were also given to give a practical edge to the sessions. The classes were conducted in the studio located in the B Block building at the VSJMC department. Dr Amit Channa talked about the world of filmmaking and the nuances of making a good production. Dr Aneela talked about the scripting for a short video and Dr Manoj gave a brief about the Relation between the News and entertainment section. Assignments included writing a front-page newspaper summary, nonfictional brief, fiction story idea based on any news, and developing listicles of award shows and the films. The students were divided into smaller groups and were given the task of producing a shot film or documentary, for which a group of students went to a Greater Noida village known as Bisrakh, the birthplace of Ravana to document the history and to shed a light on the life of Raavan and his family which is discussed widely

Value added Course on 'Advanced Editorial Skills: Editorial Writing and Editorial Cartoons'





Fact Checking Workshop

7ivekananda School Journalism and Mass Communication organised a twoday workshop on Fact Checking, for the students of the BAJMC department. Conducted by the Internal Research Committee, the first day of the workshop started in the Executive Room, A Block on 14th November 2022 at 3 pm. The workshop began with a welcome address to the mentor, Mr Sumit Dubey, India Editor for the reputed international news agency, Agence France-Presse (AFP) by Bhaskar fifth-semester Chakraborty, a student.

Mr Sumit Dubey from AFP began the session with an interactive introduction to what Fact Checking is all about, his first-hand experiences and background in the field along with a quick overview of the first encounter of the students on various fake news and the basics of mis/disinformation. Mr Dubey then went forward and explained briefly on technical aspects of what fact-checking is all about. Mr Dubey elaborated on the various tools and techniques used by him such as Reverse image search using Google, Yandex, etc and other practices like Geolocation and thumbnail research.

Discussing the importance of analysing and getting the correct information and identifying fake news, the mentors gave several hands-on tasks to the students to try the tools and find out the source of various images and fake news clips. The Bootcamp session was very interactive and provided the students with a glance into what fact-checking is all about and how the various techniques can be used to identify and acknowledge the various news pieces that are



floated to create misinformation/ disinformation. The first concluded with a short Q&A session followed by the faculty coordinator of the internal research committee, Dr Ravi Chaturvedi and Mr Ghulam Hussain thanking Mr Dubey for his input in educating the students in a meritorious manner. The second day of the workshop started in the Executive Room on 15th November 2022 at 3 pm. The workshop began with a welcome address to the mentor Mohd. Salman, a reputed fact checker and a journalist with BOOM live by Om Vashisht, 5th semester student of VSJMC. Mohd. Salman from BOOM Live began the session with an interactive introduction to what Fact Checking is all about, his first-hand experiences while being in this field for several years now and the importance to check and verify using various reverse image search tools and video meta data search tools as the narratives built by the people profiting off of this fake news is very polarizing in the society. Discussing the importance of analyzing and getting the correct information and identifying fake news, the mentors gave several hands-on tasks to the students to try the tools and find out the source of various images, videos and fake news clips. The Bootcamp session was very interactive and provided the students with a glance into what fact-checking is all about and how the various techniques can be used to identify and acknowledge the various news pieces that are floated to spin narratives in daily lives and how to save oneself from being the victim of such narratives. The second day concluded with a short Q&A session followed




VIPS Rhythm Induction


Bridge Course with OneCricket

Surmounting Challenges Screening of Film by DMRC

The film has won the Best Promotional Film Award (Non-Feature Film) at the 68th National Film Awards 2020. The 28-minute long film shows the various construction-related challenges faced by DMRC during its third phase of expansion. In order to bring this film to life, it was necessary to shoot extensively in various locations and retrieve relevant archival material. In anticipation of the filming, for about five to six years from the start of construction, the entire construction process was recorded with videos and photographs for all corridors. With editing and other post-production requirements, the film took him over a year to make. Sh. Anuj Dayal, Principal Executive Director, Delhi Metro, conducted the discussion on the screening.

The competition was concluded with the announcement of the results, prize distribution to the








Friday is Khadi Day




VSJMC Celebrated Ethnic Day



Dharmender Gupta Masaan was Neeraj Ghaywan's directorial debut and was written by Varun Grover, it is considered one of the best films of contemporary Hindi cinema. The film had Richa Chadha and Vicky Kaushal as leads. It also starred Sanjay Mishra, Pankai Tripathi and Shweta Tripathi who was also a debutant at

It was also screened at 68th Cannes Film Festival in the Un Certain Regard section and received a five minutes long standing ovation. Masaan ended up winning in the category and also won the FIPRESCI, International of Film Critics prize. After the successful screening by FilmSutra, the moderator began with the discussion. The first topic that was discussed was about locations in a film being a character and contributing in the plot as much as any other character and how beautifully it was captured by Ghaywan. In films like Masaan, Banaras city had a personality of its

own, helping in steering the lives of the characters. The discussion also addressed the fact that with the help of Masaan, Neeraj Ghaywan and Varun Grover commented on two very serious issues faced by the Indian society; how tough a woman's life is and how the caste system still affects the lives and decisions of people in India. The performance of the actors also came up and the one character that shone was of Pankaj Tripathi. Students talked about how he was on screen for less than five minutes and it was a delight to see him. The most prominent topic of discussion was how the film talked about dealing with grief and pain.



courtroom drama typically Thas at least some of the following components: a fiery orator, high stakes, a developing case, exciting deliberations, and some sort of resolution—even if it isn't a pleasant one. All of these are absent from "Court". In terms of staidness, the case itself is astounding. Jargon is frequently used in disputes, some of which may even be unnecessary. A resolution seems impossible for most of the 116 minutes it lasts. The trial of a guy with few words and a powerful voice named Narayan Kamble (Vira Sathidar) centres the court. As his attorney Vinay (Vivek Gomber, who is also the film's producer), learns the accusation against Kamble is that he encouraged the suicide of a nearby sewage worker during one of his performances in a Mumbai slum. In addition to citing Kamble's prior sedition proceedings and implying connections to antinational groups, Nutan (Geetanjali Kulkarni), the public prosecutor, draws attention to evidence of suicide. Cinematographer Mrinal

Desai uses extended, static takes, echoing the case's apparent endless drawl in the film's approach. When other directors Would have chosen to cut, scenes continue for a few seconds or even minutes after that. This ultimately improves the film's realism, making the action appear more accidental than forced. The flawless attention to detail in the setting of the movie is also on display. While one character is being attacked outside of a restaurant, the framing allows you to see the security guard flee into the protection of the structure, the continuous compels you to observe what he is successfully evading. The fact that "Court" treats the audience as both a witness and a jury and presents a lengthy case for them to consider may be the reason why it succeeds as a superb courtroom drama. This one is difficult to forget long after the last credits have rolled. The end of the film was followed by a discussion with the audience. Naman, an audience member, gave details about what he observed in film. He observed how the camera

was placed and how all the shots were from an observer perspective, the use of long shots without any cuts in between and the scenes related to lawyer and judge were very easy to understand. He states how every character's life has such a varying dynamic and yet they are adjudicating the character named "Narayan Kamble", someone's life other characters can't relate to at all. Another member of the audience said he noticed the way the film was shot and how serious everything was in the movie, No background sounds, No songs and there was nothing typical like other Bollywood movies. After getting a good response from the audience Dr. Priyam Ghosh discussed some main points with the audience. She talked about multiple scenes in the film, with their significance and meaning. The discussion also went in the direction of caste and gender roles, with reference to the lives of different characters in the film. The screening ended with a 'thank you' message by the anchor.





After the successful screening by FilmSutra, the moderator began with the discussion. The first topic that was discussed was about police brutality, social injustice to tribal communities portrayed in the film. Jai Bhim captured caste-based



discrimination to those who are deprived and made to languish on the fringes of our society. Students also talked about Suriya's stunning performance as an advocate in the film. His dedicated involvement in narration of deeply appealing story-telling methods was widely appreciated during the discussion.



The Advertising Society aims **I** to provide an opportunity for students to learn more about advertising through activities. discussions, workshops and competitions. It will help them develop creative thinking skills, exchange knowledge, keep up-todate on the marketing world, and have hands-on experience with techniques to drive creativity. This will help them build portfolios and networks that will help them get industry ready. The proposed activities to groom students to be industry-ready include weekly discussions, quiz or Ad Mad in November 2022, Workshop/ Guest Lecture by an expert in December 2022 or January 2023, Advertising Film Festival in March 2023, and two stages of selection: group discussion and personal interview. Group discussion topics include influence marketing, ads portraying society, role of advertisements in social change, ASCI guidelines, and impact on youth. Students who get selected would have to fill an official membership form that will be renewed yearly on the basis of their performance and involvement.



Digital Marketing Workshop

The session on November 16, 2022, by Mr. Neeraj Gupta started with a few questions. He then moved on and talked about social media and aspirational brands. He mentioned that the digital shelf life is much less, making it clear that the things

learned in the session might be outdated in 5-6 months. During the session, he also mentioned terms like "engagement, like-share-comment, cost per engagement, and impressions". These terms are all linked to digital marketing and play an integral role in

order to create a successful digital campaign. Awareness-Consideration-Conversion-Loyalty-Advocacy are the terms of the digital marketing funnel which is concerned with the best results and higher engagement. The most important details in digital marketing are to find and select the final of any campaign to drive the business impact in the market. The message you want to deliver to the public is a 'FOMO' factor, which can be created through content to create hype for your product or service and show the urgency of any product or service that is 'limited in stock'. While talking about measuring engagement, he talked third-party measurement tools like Hootsuite, adobe campaign, and unmetric. The discussion then moved toward virtual reality. A metaverse is a shared virtual space that people can access through the comforts of their homes while still being in an immersive sensory virtual environment. Big brands that are exploring the metaverse like Hyundai, Gucci etc. It is important to understand web 3.0 as it is considered the future of technology and brands are already invested in learning and adopting this technology in order to connect with their stakeholders. 
Photowalk





A Visit to Museo Camera

The visit to the museum started with a brief introduction to the students and teachers about the museum by Mr. Aditya Arya, founder of the museum to cut down some of their inquisitiveness. In his briefing he talked about the history of photography and technological development in the field. The museum grew out of Mr. Arya's personal collection which includes about 5000+ cameras and other photographic equipment which go back to the 1850s. It all began in 2009 in his basement and today it is the largest not-for-profit crowd funded Centre for Photographic Arts in South-east Asia. He also mentioned "there is only one rule here, take as many pictures as you can." The visit was organized for the students of 2nd semester. The visit was scheduled in two slots of two hours for the students of first and second shift, the slots were 10 am - 12 pm and 01 pm - 03 pmrespectively. On the ground floor, as you enter the museum, you see a chandelier made of the oldest Yashica and Hasselblad cameras which as per Mr. Aditya Arya is "The first Chandelier made of cameras in India". Then, moving forward, Journey of Cameras starting from the 1800s has been stated on the walls along with the display of antique cameras and lenses. You also come across a room known as the 'darkroom' used for developing the negative photographs. Moving to the first floor, photographs at the time of

the Independence struggle and Queens & Kings of the royal kings were displayed. Along with the Photographic elements, many ancient artifacts such as the bioscope, gramophones etc. were also displayed. The gallery also had eye-catching abstract photographs clicked by the photography enthusiasts.

Students of the second semester thoroughly enjoyed their weekend visit to Museo Camera Centre for Photographic Arts as everyone was seen clicking pictures, having interactive discussions with their peers and teachers. It was indeed a great learning experience.




